

So, what Law WERE all these people under?




Acts 10:34 I most certainly understand now that God is not one to show partiality

- 5. Let us do evil that evil may be ALLOWED.


## Now that I've actually LOOKED...

I rather think, now, that Moses RAISED standards.



# If, in all the Old Testament, God Lowered Moral or Marriage Law:

- 1. He never SAID He did. (No Command)
- 2. He never gave an example. (No Example)
- 3. He never implied that He did. (No Inference)
- 4. He'd have yielded to sin.
- 5. He'd have been partial to sinners.
- 6. He'd have permitted covenant breaking.
- 7. He'd have abandoned the wives & children.
- 8. He'd have allowed evil that evil might come.

### Four Bedrock Principles:
