1. What did Naomi tell Ruth in verse 1?

Shall I not seek security for you

Ruth 3:1 (NASB)

¹ Then Naomi her mother-in-law said to her, "My daughter, shall I not seek security for you, that it may be well with you?

Ruth 3:1 (KJV)

¹ Then Naomi her mother in law said unto her, **My daughter, shall I not seek rest for thee**, that it may be well with thee?

Ruth 3:1 (NIV)

1. One day Naomi her mother-in-law said to her, "My daughter, should I not try to find a home for you, where you will be provided for?

- 1. What did Naomi tell Ruth in verse 1?
- 3:1. Shall I not seek **rest** for thee.
- A. Rest here is equivalent to marriage.
- B. Naomi felt that Ruth should not remain a poor gleaner in the fields.
- C. Naomi determined to take the initiative to arrange a marriage

1. What did Naomi tell Ruth in verse 1? Duties of kinship

- A. To redeem or buy back the inheritance of the poor relation, who had been compelled through poverty to part with it (Lev. 25:25).
- B. To buy back or redeem the person who was sold into slavery (Lev. 25:47-49).
- C. Incase his relative's lineage had been cut off by death, thus blotting out his name and house in Israel. The kinsman was to raise a son to his dead brother (Deut. 25:5-7), so that his name be not put out of Israel

2. What were Naomi's instructions to Ruth?

Ruth 3:2-4

- ² "Now is not Boaz our kinsman, with whose maids you were? Behold, he winnows barley at the threshing floor tonight.
- ³ "Wash yourself therefore, and anoint yourself and put on your best clothes, and go down to the threshing floor; but do not make yourself known to the man until he has finished eating and drinking.
- ⁴ "It shall be when he lies down, that you shall notice the place where he lies, and you shall go and uncover his feet and lie down; then he will tell you what you shall do."

2. What were Naomi instructions to Ruth?

- 1. Wash yourself
- 2. Anoint yourself
- 3. Put on your best clothes,
- 4. Go down to the threshing floor
- 5. But do not make yourself known to the man until he has finished eating and drinking.
- 6. You shall notice the place where he lies
- 7. You shall go and uncover his feet and lie down
- 8. He will tell you what you shall do.

3. What was Ruth's response to Naomi?

All that you say I will do

Ruth 3:5-8

- ⁵ She said to her, "All that you say I will do."
- ⁶ So she went down to the threshing floor and did according to all that her mother-in-law had commanded her.
- When Boaz had eaten and drunk and his heart was merry, he went to lie down at the end of the heap of grain; and she came secretly, and uncovered his feet and lay down.
- ⁸ It happened in the middle of the night that the man was startled and bent forward; and behold, a woman was lying at his feet.

4. What was the conversation Boaz and Ruth had on the threshing floor? Boaz — Who are you?

Ruth - I am Ruth your maid. So spread your covering over your maid, for you are a close relative.

Ruth 3:9

9 He said, "Who are you?" And she answered, "I am Ruth your maid. So spread your covering over your maid, for you are a close relative."

- 1. Ruth was seeking redemption
- 2. Ruth righteously appealed to Boaz to marry her according to the levirate custom. (Deut. 25: 5 10)

Ruth 3:9

⁹ He said, "Who are you?" And she answered, "I am Ruth your maid. So spread your covering over your maid, for you are a close relative."

Ruth 2:12

¹² "May the LORD reward your work, and your wages be full from the LORD, the **God of Israel**, under **whose wings you have come to seek refuge**."

Ezekiel 16:8

8 "Then I passed by you and saw you, and behold, you were at the time for love; so I spread My skirt over you and covered your nakedness. I also swore to you and entered into a covenant with you so that you became Mine," declares the Lord GOD.

John 1:14

Spiritual Relationship

Ruth is seeking Redemption (vs. 9) **Christians have Redemption in Christ**

Ephesians 1:7 ⁷ In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of His grace

Ruth appealed to Boaz to marry her The church is the bride of Christ according to the levirate custom [Deut. 25: 5 – 10] (vs. 9) **Ephesians 5:25-27** ²⁵ Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself up for her, ²⁶ so that He might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word, ²⁷ that He might present to Himself the church in all her glory, having no spot or wrinkle or any such thing; but that she would be holy and blameless.

Physical Relationship

Ruth was seeking a home, a resting place, a place of provision, love, peace, and security – provided by a loving husband (Boaz) (vs. 9)

Spiritual Relationship

Christians are seeking a heavenly home

1 Timothy 6:11-12

¹¹ But flee from these things, you man of God, and pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, perseverance *and* gentleness.

Fight the good fight of faith; take hold of the eternal life to which you were called, and you made the good confession in the presence of many witnesses.

7 so that <u>being justified by His grace we</u> would be made heirs according to the hope of eternal life.

- 2. You have shown your last kindness to be better than the first by not going after young men, whether poor or rich
- 3. You are a woman of excellence

Then he said, "May you be blessed of the LORD, my daughter. You have shown your last kindness to be better than the first by not going after young men, whether poor or rich.

"Now, my daughter, do not fear. I will do for you whatever you ask, for all my people in the city know that you are a woman of excellence.

7. What bad news did Boaz give her in verse 12? There is a relative closer than Boaz.

Ruth 3:12

¹² "Now it is true I am a close relative; however, there is a relative closer than I.

8A. What did Boaz ask Ruth to do?

A. Stay the night

Ruth 3:13

13 "Remain this night, and when morning comes, if he will redeem you, good; let him redeem you. But if he does not wish to redeem you, then I will redeem you, as the LORD lives. Lie down until morning.

B. What did Boaz promise Ruth?

When morning comes, if he will redeem you, good; let him redeem you. But if he does not wish to redeem you, then I will redeem you, as the LORD lives.

9. Why did she rise very early in the morning? Let it not be known that the woman came to the threshing floor

Ruth 3:14

¹⁴ So she lay at his feet until morning and rose before one could recognize another; and he said, "Let it not be known that the woman came to the threshing floor."

6 measures of barley

Ruth 3:15

¹⁵ Again he said, "Give me the cloak that is on you and hold it." So she held it, and he measured **six** *measures* **of barley** and laid *it* on her. Then she went into the city.

- 17 She said, "These six measures of barley he gave to me, for he said, 'Do not go to your mother-in-law empty-handed.'"
- 18 Then she said, "Wait, my daughter, until you know how the matter turns out; for the man will not rest until he has settled it today."
