JOY





- 1. As noted in Gal. 5:22, the fruit of the Spirit involves "joy." THEREFORE: It is necessarily inferred that...
- 2. A relationship exists between the Holy Spirit and joy:
- The kingdom of God is "joy in the Holy Spirit" (Rom. 14:17).
- The Thessalonians had received the word "with joy of the Holy Spirit" (1 Thess. 1:6).



- I. <u>The Definition of "Joy"</u>
- A. The Greek word is "CHARA"...
 - 1. Thayer defines as "joy, gladness."
 - 2. Vine adds "delight."
 - 3. The word is used 60 times in the NT



- I. <u>The Definition of "Joy"</u>
- **B.** The verb form of "CHARA" is "CHAIREIN"
 - 1. It is most often translated "to rejoice"
 - 2. It is used 72 times in the NT





I. <u>The Definition of "Joy"</u>

C. Closely related is the word "CHARIS"...

- 1. The word most often translated as "grace"
- 2. Grace is "that which bestows pleasure, delight, or causes favorable regard."

"My grace is sufficient for you." (2 Cor. 12:9)

3. Therefore, grace and joy are necessarily connected.



D. Notice the connection between "Grace" and "Joy"

- 1. It is because God has extended His grace to us that we may have Joy whatever our situation in life.
- 2. Grace is nothing less than God's love in action.
- 3. Grace is God sending His only son to the cross so that we guilty ones might be reconciled to Himself through the forgiveness of sins.
- 2. The ever-present knowledge that we are the recipients of God's saving grace is both the "source" and the "impetus" of all joy.



The Joy of the Lord is enduring.

- 1. God wants Christians to have joy (Jn. 15:11).
- 2. He gives joy "inexpressible and full of glory" (1Pet. 1:6-8).
 - a. Unlike the "passing pleasures of sin" (Heb. 11:25).
 - b. Good things in life may be "vanity" (Ecc. 2:10-11).
- 3. "Rejoice in the Lord always" (Phil. 4:4).



- II. <u>Sources of Christian Joy</u>
- A. Joy is a consequence of faith...
 - 1. Joy comes from "a confident trust" in God (Phil. 1:25).
 - a. Without faith in God and Christ, there is no lasting joy.
 - **b.** Why is faith essential to joy?
 - Faith dispels "worry," "doubt" and "fear" (Mat. 6:25-30).
 - Faith comes from the Word of God (Rom. 10:17).
 - In turn faith produces joy (Rom. 15:13).
 - 2. All the teachings of Jesus give joy (Jn. 15:11; 17:13).



B. Joy is also the result of obedience...

1. Obedience to the Word of God creates joy.

a. The Samaritans. (Acts 8:5-8)

b. The Ethiopian eunuch. (Acts 8:35-38)

c. The Thessalonians. (<u>1Thess. 1:6</u>)

2. Disobedience dispels joy and causes fear. (Heb. 10:26-27)



- C. Joy is also a consequence of forgiveness.
 - 1. Sin robs people of joy. (Rom. 7:22-24)
 - 2. Forgiveness creates and stimulates joy. (Rom. 5:1-2, 10-11)



- **D.** Joy also results from Christian fellowship
 - **1.** It is a joy just to observe such fellowship.
 - a. Philemon's love and fellowship gave Paul joy. (Phm. 7)
 - **b.** He rejoiced that brethren had been restored. (2 Cor. 7:7)
 - 2. It is also a joy to experience such fellowship.
 - a. Paul rejoiced in fellowship with the Philippians. (Phi. 4:10)
 - b. John had joy when brethren were united. (2 Jn. 12)



- **E. Joy comes from Christian service**
 - 1. It is a joy to spread the gospel.
 - a. Barnabas: conversions at Antioch (Acts 11:20-23)
 - **b.** Christian Jews: conversion of the Gentiles (Acts 15:3)
 - 2. There is great joy in seeing the spiritual progress of others.
 - a. A source of joy to Paul (Rom. 16:19; Col. 2:5; 1Thess. 3:6-9)
 - b. John wrote that this was the highest form of joy (3 Jn. 4)
 - c. Those whom we have brought to Christ will be a joy:
 - **1) Now**
 - 2) In the day of Christ (1Thess. 2:19-20)





Jesus speaks of Joy on the way to the Garden of Gethsemane.

(John 15:11)









Jesus prayed for Joy in the lives of His disciples (John 17:13).

- In just a few hours Jesus will be HANGING on a CROSS.
- The JOY that Jesus had was from the Father.







"...for the JOY set before Him, Jesus endured the cross, scorning the shame..." (Hebrews 12:2)

- The JOY of providing a way by which man can be saved.
- The JOY of fulfilling His purpose on earth.
- The JOY of returning home to the Father.
