
* Paul uses this word in 2 Corinthians 10:1 - Now I, Paul, myself urge you by the meekness and gentleness of Christ-I who am meek when

* The usage in this passage applies more apply to an idea of clemency, of mildness - that is the gentle forgiving nature of Christ that Paul




prautes - mildness, humility, meekness

In the context of our focus verse, Galatians 5:23, gentleness is the growing virtue we develop which allows us to show humility in a world of arrogance, to be mild in the face of worldly fierceness, and to be meek when surrounded by a crowd of worldly, overbearing people.



- * Paul continues this idea in the very next chapter
- and especially to those who are of the household of the faith.

* Galatians 6:1-10 Brethren, even if anyone is caught in any trespass, you who are spiritual, restore such a one in a spirit of gentleness; each one looking to yourself, so that you too will not be tempted. 2 Bear one another's burdens, and thereby fulfill the law of Christ. 3 For if anyone thinks he is something when he is nothing, he deceives himself. 4 But each one must examine his own work, and then he will have reason for boasting in regard to himself alone, and not in regard to another. 5 For each one will bear his own load. 6 The one who is taught the word is to share all good things with the one who teaches him. 7 Do not be deceived, God is not mocked; for whatever a man sows, this he will also reap. 8 For the one who sows to his own flesh will from the flesh reap corruption, but the one who sows to the Spirit will from the Spirit reap eternal life. 9 Let us not lose heart in doing good, for in due time we will reap if we do not grow weary. 10 So then, while we have opportunity, let us do good to all people,



* "The spirit of the world gloats over sin; the Spirit of Christ leads us to restore the sinner. 




- Paul "discussed" gentleness with the Corinthians

* 2 Corinthians 10:1-11 - here our word is translated meekness, and as we looked at before the word gentleness is the first definition - clemency




Paul admonished Timothy to grow in gentleness as well fruit of the Spirit


Paul taught Timothy that the Lord's bond-servant must be gentle when correcting those in opposition.


2 Timothy 2:24-26 - This instruction was important for Timothy and equally important for us today when spreading the Word in a world full of stubborn opposition.

1 Timothy 6:9-11 - an admonishment to pursue spiritual growth and




- * James reminds us how important gentleness is as a fruit to be nurtured and grown in the wisdom of the word.
- * James 3:13-18 Wisdom is gentle and pursues peace.






* 1 Peter 3:13-17 Peter tells Christians to always be ready to tell those in your world, why you have hope, in a gentle and respectful even God-fearing way.
