- ¹ For it is **superfluous for me to write to you** about this ministry to the saints;
- 2 Corinthians 9:1 (KJV)
- ¹ For as touching the ministering to the saints, it is **superfluous for me to write to you**:
- 2 Corinthians 9:1 (NIV2011)
 ¹ <u>There is no need for me to write to you</u> about this service to the Lord's people.
- 2 Corinthians 9:1 (CEV)
 ¹ I don't need to write you about the money you plan to give for God's people.

2 Corinthians 9:2

- ² for <u>I know your readiness</u>, of which <u>I boast about you to the</u> <u>Macedonians</u>, *namely*, that <u>Achaia has been prepared since</u> <u>Iast year</u>, and your <u>zeal has stirred up most of them</u>.
- 1. They are <u>ready to help</u> Love
- 2. They have beenFaith workingpreparing for a yearand active

3. Why were the messengers being sent?

2 Corinthians 9:3-5

³ But I have <u>sent the brethren</u>, in order that <u>our boasting about you may not</u> <u>be made empty in this case</u>, so that, as I was saying, <u>you may be prepared</u>;
⁴ otherwise if any Macedonians come with me and find you unprepared, we—not to speak of you—will be put to shame by this confidence.
⁵ So I thought it necessary to urge the brethren that they would go on ahead to you and arrange beforehand your previously <u>promised bountiful gift, so that</u> <u>the same would be ready as a bountiful gift</u> and not affected by

covetousness.

- 2. You may be prepared
- 3. Promised bountiful gift may be ready

4. What is the relation between sowing and reaping? 2 Corinthians 9:6

⁶ Now this *I say*, he who <u>sows sparingly</u> will also <u>reap</u> <u>sparingly</u>, and he who <u>sows bountifully</u> will also <u>reap</u> <u>bountifully</u>.

Physical Realm

1. The farmer who **sows** seed **sparingly** will **reap** a meager harvest

2. The farmer **who sows bountifully will reap** a great harvest

Spiritual Realm

1. Giving will result in blessings from God.

A. Generous givers will <u>reap</u> generous blessings from God.

B. <u>Those who hold back selfishly</u> <u>fearing loss will forfeit their gain</u>.

³⁸ "<u>Give, and it will be given to you</u>. They will pour into your lap a good measure—pressed down, shaken together, *and* running over. <u>For by your standard of</u> <u>measure it will be measured to you in return</u>."

⁷ Do not be deceived, God is not mocked; for <u>whatever</u> <u>a man sows, this he will also reap</u>.

⁸ For the one who sows to his own flesh will from the flesh reap corruption, but the one who sows to the Spirit will from the Spirit reap eternal life.

- to you, they have their reward in full.
- ³ "But when you give to the poor, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing,
- ⁴ so that your giving will be in secret; and your Father who sees what is done in secret will reward you.

⁴³ Calling His disciples to Him, He said to them, "Truly I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the contributors to the treasury;

⁴⁴ for they all put in out of their surplus, but she, out of her poverty, put in all she owned, all she had to live on."

6. How does God reward a cheerful giver? 2 Corinthians 9:8-9

⁸ And God is able to make <u>all grace abound to you</u>, so that <u>always having all sufficiency in everything</u>, you may <u>have</u> <u>an abundance for every good deed</u>;

⁹ as it is written, "HE SCATTERED ABROAD, HE GAVE TO THE POOR, HIS RIGHTEOUSNESS ENDURES FOREVER."

7. Why did Paul pray that God supply and multiply the seed sown by the Corinthians?

2 Corinthians 9:10

¹⁰ Now <u>He who supplies seed to the sower and</u> bread for food will supply and multiply your seed for sowing and *increase the harvest of your righteousness*;

8. How will we be enriched in vs. 11? 2 Corinthians 9:11

¹¹ you will be <u>enriched in everything for all liberality</u>, which <u>through us is producing thanksgiving to God</u>.

- 1. In everything for all liberality
- 2. Through us is producing thanksgiving to God
- 1 Corinthians 10:31 ³¹ Whether, then, you eat or drink or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God.

9. What four things did the administration of this service (the collection) supply?

2 Corinthians 9:12-14 ¹² For the **ministry of this service** is not only **fully** supplying the needs of the saints, but is also overflowing through *many thanksgivings to God*. ¹³ Because of the proof given by this ministry, they will glorify God for your obedience to your confession of the gospel of Christ and for the *liberality of your contribution* to them and to all, ¹⁴ while they also, by *prayer on your behalf*, yearn for you because of the surpassing grace of God in you.
