# Resurrection in the Gospels

Resurrection Sunday

#### 5 Themes

- 1. Resurrection is a bodily reality
- 2. Jesus was resurrected first (firstfruit); we will follow later
- 3. Judgement of all men is connected with the return of Jesus and our resurrection
- 4. Jesus' resurrection establishes his lordship and hence divinity
- 5. Resurrection is used as a metaphor for our converted life

#### Prelude to Sunday

- Jesus hastily buried on Friday before sunset, Matthew 27:57-60; Mark 15:42-46; Luke 24:50-54
  - Jesus is wrapped in a linen shroud, Matthew 27:59
  - Body prepared with 75 lbs. of myrrh and aloes, John 19:39
  - Placed in new tomb belonging to Joseph of Arimathea
    - Tomb is sealed with a great stone, Matthew 27:60
    - Mary Magdalene and Galilean women observe the location, planning to later return to finish preparing the body, Mark 15:47; Luke 24:55-56
    - Roman guards placed by Jews, Matthew 27:62-66

- Mary and others rise before dawn (John 20:1)
- Arrive at the tomb at dawn, Luke 24:1
  - Purpose if to complete preparation for burial
  - The women express worry about moving the stone, Mark 16:3
- Earthquake before they arrive at tomb, Matthew 28:2
  - Angel moves the stone and sits on it
  - Jesus leaves the tomb
  - Guards flee to Jerusalem in fear, Matthew 28:4, 11-15

- Mary and others discover
  - Stone rolled away, tomb is open, Luke 24:2
  - Two angels are present, Luke 24:4
  - One of the angels tells them Jesus is risen, Matthew 28:7
  - The women examine the tomb and find it empty, Matthew 28:5-6; Luke 24:3
  - The women instructed to tell the disciples that Jesus is risen, Matthew 28:7
  - In fear and joy, the women tell Peter and John, Matthew 28:8; Mark 16:7; John 20:1-2

- Peter and John run to the tomb, John 20:3-10
  - Peter enters first and finds it empty save for the shroud and face cloth neatly folded
  - John enters
  - The two men return home

- Mary remains at the tomb weeping outside, John 20:11
  - As she turns away, Jesus appears to her (though she did not recognize him), John 20:14-15 (Mark indicates this is the first appearance, Mark 16:9)
  - When he calls her by name, she knows it is Jesus, John 20:16
  - She clings to him, John 20:17
- Jesus appears to the other women as they are headed to the disciples, Matthew 28:9
- They take hold of his feet and worship

- Mary reports having seen Jesus to the disciples, John 20:18
- Mary's report is not believed, Mark 16:11

- Later in the day, Jesus travels with two men to Emmaus, Luke 24:13-27
  - Jesus eats with the two men and then leaves, Luke 24:28-32

• At some point (before or after meeting the two men) Jesus appears to Peter, Luke 24:34; I Corinthians 15:5

- The two men return to Jerusalem to find the apostles and others, Luke 24:33
- Later that evening, Jesus appears to the two men and 10 apostles, Luke 24:36-49; John 20:19-23
  - Jesus eats with them, Luke 24:48
  - Jesus reiterates that he was meant to die and be raised
