Timeline of Post-Resurrection Appearances

 Day after Passover Saturday 	 Acts 1:1-5 40 days	• Acts 1:6-11	 50 days after Passover (Sunday)

Post-ascension appearances to Stephen (Acts 7:55-56) and Paul

5 Themes

- 1. Resurrection is a bodily reality
- 2. Jesus was resurrected first (firstfruit); we will follow later
- 3. Judgement of all men is connected with the return of Jesus and our resurrection
- 4. Jesus' resurrection establishes his lordship and hence divinity
- 5. Resurrection is used as a metaphor for our converted life

- Appearance to Thomas, John 20:24-29
 - Thomas is absent during the first appearance to the company of disciples including 11 apostles and the two men from Emmaus, Luke 24:33-49; John 20:19-23
 - They saw his hands and feet
 - He ate with them
 - He taught them
 - He breathed on them, imparting the Holy Spirit
 - He instructed them to wait in Jerusalem for the Spirit's power

- Appearance to Thomas, John 20:24-29
 - Thomas is told of the appearance, remains incredulous
 - After eight days, he appears when Thomas is present, John 20:24-29 (appearance #2)
 - The "disciples" are again together

The passage that follows (John 20:30-31) indicates that the resurrection is profound proof of Jesus' divinity.

- Appearance to 7 apostles at the Sea of Galilee. Five are named; Peter, Thomas, Nathanael, James, and John. (John 21:1-24)
 - The "third" appearance to this group after resurrection, John 21:14
 - Jesus was eventually recognized this time, John 21:4, 12
 - Jesus prepares a meal and eats with them
 - Interaction with Peter specifically
 - Question re. John and misunderstanding the answer

- Jesus commissioned the apostles, Matthew 28:16-20
 - At a mountain in Galilee that Jesus chose, v. 10, 16
 - They "worshipped" and "doubted", v. 17
 - Jesus claims all power in heaven and earth, v.18
 - Apostles sent out to teach, v. 19-20

- Final appearance at Bethany, Luke 24:50-53; Acts 1:1-9
 - Chosen apostles, Acts 1:2, 4
 - Instruction to wait in Jerusalem for power from the Holy Spirit, Acts 1:4-5
 - Further teaching about the kingdom
 - Discussion about the timing of the "restoration of the kingdom to Israel"

- Other, less detailed, appearances mentioned by Paul
 - 500 brethren at once, many still alive and capable of testifying, I Corinthians 15:6
 - To James (Jesus' brother, not the apostle), I Corinthians 15:7
