Paul's Arguments that Involve Baptism

- Paul didn't teach a "baptism class"
- Take care not to isolate statements from theological context
 - New redeemed identity "Who are we?"
 - New redeemed ethic "How shall we then live?"
 - New redeemed expectant worldview

 "Seeing as God sees ."
- Baptism connects us with Jesus' life-changing impact

Romans 6:1-14 (ASV)

Rom 6:1 What shall we say then? Shall we continue in sin, that grace may abound?

- <u>**Rom 6:2</u>** God forbid. We who died to sin, how shall we any longer live therein?</u>
- Rom 6:3 Or are ye ignorant that all we who were baptized

into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?

Rom 6:4 We were buried therefore with him through baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we also might walk in newness of life. Rom 6:5 For if we have become united with him in the likeness of his death, we shall be also in the *likeness* of his resurrection; **Rom 6:6** knowing this, that our old man was crucified with *him*, that the body of sin might be done away, that so we should no longer be in bondage to sin; **Rom 6:7** for he that hath died is justified from sin.

<u>**Rom 6:8**</u> But if we died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him;

<u>Rom 6:9</u> knowing that Christ being raised from the dead dieth no more; death no more hath dominion over him.

Rom 6:10 For the death that he died, he died unto sin once: but the life that he liveth, he liveth unto God.

<u>Rom 6:11</u> Even so reckon ye also yourselves to be dead unto sin, but alive unto God in Christ Jesus.

Rom 6:12 Let not sin therefore reign in your mortal body, that ye should obey the lusts thereof: Rom 6:13 neither present your members unto sin as instruments of unrighteousness; but present yourselves unto God, as alive from the dead, and your members as instruments of righteousness unto God.

Rom 6:14 For sin shall not have dominion over you: for ye are not under law, but under grace.
