"Worship" is only properly directed to God – never to men or even to angels

Men (they are like us),
Acts 14:8-15

Angels, though higher than man, are still not worthy of worship
Deuteronomy 4:15-19 (Cf. II Kings 21:3)
Colossians 2:18
Revelation 22:8-9

We do not "serve" God as if He needs anything we can supply

The God that made the world and all things therein, he, being Lord of heaven and earth, dwelleth not in temples made with hands; neither is he served by men's hands, as though he needed anything, seeing he himself giveth to all life, and breath, and all things... (Acts 17:24-25 ASV)

How, then can we serve Him?

Worship, G4352 proskuneo

- 1) to kiss the hand to (towards) one, in token of reverence
- 2) among the Orientals, especially the Persians, to fall upon the knees and touch the ground with the forehead as an expression of profound reverence
- 3) in the NT by kneeling or prostration to do homage (to one) or make obeisance, whether in order to express respect or to make supplication
 - a) used of homage shown to men and beings of superior rank (Jewish High Priests; God; Jesus; heavenly beings; demons)

- Serve, G3000 latreuo
- 1) to serve for hire
- 2) to serve, minister to, either to the gods or men and used alike of slaves and freemen
 - a) in the NT, to render religious service or homage, to worship
 - b) to perform sacred services, to offer gifts, to worship God in the observance of the rites instituted for his worship, used of priests, to officiate, to discharge the sacred office

Priests Serve the People Making Sacrifices

The killing took place in the court of the Temple, and might be performed by a layman, although the blood had to be caught by a priest, and rows of priests with gold or silver cups in their hands stood in line from the Temple court to the altar, where the blood was sprinkled. These cups were rounded on the bottom, so that they could not be set down; for in that case the blood might coagulate. The priest who caught the blood as it dropped from the victim then handed the cup to the priest next to him, receiving from him an empty one, and the full cup was passed along the line until it reached the last priest, who sprinkled its contents on the altar. The lamb was then hung upon special hooks or sticks and skinned; but if the eve of the Passover fell on a Sabbath, the skin was removed down to the breast only. The abdomen was then cut open, and the fatty portions intended for the altar were taken out, placed in a vessel, salted, and offered by the priest on the altar, while the remaining entrails likewise were taken out and cleansed.
