

Thanks to Dean for illustrating the difficult concept of the comparison and <u>contrast</u> of Adam and Jesus. I would add only this...

- Through Adam's sin Death entered the world
- Through Jesus sacrifice, not only did He erase Adam's sin, He erased ALL OUR SIN's
 - The difference is not "tit for tat" but Jesus' sacrifice was SO MUCH MORE than Adam's sin yes it erased Adam's sin, but it also erased the sins of MANY.
 - Jesus didn't just undo what Adam did He undid what WE ALL DID.

- False Inference from 5:20 repudiated
 - Paul vigorously refutes the idea that just because grace is more than sufficient to cover all sin that Christians should live sinfully that grace may abound
 - God forbid! Far from it! May it not be so!
 - Paul refutes that inference in the strongest way possible

- Death to sin inconsistent with Life in sin
 - How can a Christian contemplate living in sin?
 - It would compare to a living dead person
 - This is Paul's first reference to a death to sin
 - He has spoken of the death of Christ for sin (4:25)
 - And the death of Christ for sinners (5:6,8)
 - Death to sin was a part of faith

- Death to sin unfolded: When it took place It's results
 - Baptism into death
 - We share His death in order to share His resurrection life
 - He laid down His life, not to stay dead, but to take it again – John 10:17

- For if we have become united with Him in the likeness of His death...
 - Vs 5 United together sumphutos grown together
- Knowing this, that our old man was crucified with Him
 - Vs 6 our sinful man united with Him in His death to do away that life dominated by sin

- For the one who has died is freed from sin
 - Freedom from sin is the spiritual death of that old man in baptism
 - Baptism is of the <u>essence of faith</u>, and certainly not something inconsistent with faith
 - The death of sin is not placed by Paul prior to baptism
 - Baptism being immersion or "burial" -

- Sharing the new life of Christ
 - We died with Christ so now we LIVE WITH CHRIST
 - He (we) died to sin on the cross.
 - Baptism is the means by which this is accomplished
 - Once for all
 - Once the penalty was paid, Jesus was done with death forever. "death is no longer His master"
 - He lives to God
 - He lives life resurrected. Death has no claim on Him

- A Christian's position in Christ in view of the facts presented
 - A Christian must consider himself dead to sin and alive unto God in Christ.
 - What Christ did applies to the Christian
 - What was true of Christ becomes true of the Christian who is in Christ.
