#### A Living Sacrifice

- "Therefore"
  - This final section is a conclusion of what we've seen in the last 11 chapters.
    - It explains the impact the gospel should have on a Christian
    - It explains HOW we should live once we understand how the "mercies of God" have been revealed to us.
    - Chapter 12:1-2 define the Christian life in a nutshell

#### A Living sacrifice

- Paul is urging Christians to understand how merciful God is and just exactly what He has done for us in Christ – and to respond to His gift willingly. He wants to win our hearts
- Paul is urging us to present the members of our bodies (Rom 6:12-13,19) as a living sacrifice (having died to sin) on the "alter"

## A Living Sacrifice

- Four Characteristics of this sacrifice
  - 1) Living
    - Dead to sin then arisen in Christ a new life
  - 2) Holy
    - Consecrated or set apart for God an "unblemished lamb"
  - 3) Acceptable to God
    - A sweet savor to God Eph 5:2 something He finds good
  - 4) Your Spiritual Service
    - Offering yourself is worship (John 16:2, Rom 9:4, Heb 9:1,6)

## The transformation required for this worship

#### • "And"

- This also must be accomplished
  - Renewing changing of the mind
  - Change that proves the will of God
    - Presenting our bodies as a sacrifice means to use our bodies to do God's will – letting Him use our bodies for His purposes
    - This use will not happen if we let the world shape us therefore we must be transformed letting the will of God shape us and change how we think.

## What does this transformation look like?

## Wordly behavior

- 1 Cor 7:31
  - Form of this world
    - Eph 2:2
      - Disobedience
    - 1 John 2:17
      - Lustful
    - Gal 1:4 Evil
    - 1 John 5:19
      - Controlled by Satan

## **Godly behavior**

- Changing our minds away from the world
  - Romans 8:5-6 -Life/Peace
- Transforming ourselves into His glory
  - 2 Cor 3:18 Glory of God
- Our aim is Godly living
  - 1 Peter 4:1-11

## Sober Thinking Consistent with God's Grace

- "For"
  - An explanation for the urging to be transformed
- "through the grace given me"
  - Paul encourages us to act within our sphere just as he worked towards the purpose set before himself
- "to everyone among you"
  - We ALL every single Christian need to be exhorted to this transformation

## Sober Thinking Consistent with God's Grace

- "not to think more highly of himself than he ought to think"
  - Gr *huperphroneo* high mindedness, haughty
  - Not necessarily of oneself but thinking above what one must think – explained by what follows
- "think so as to have sound judgement"
  - Gr *sophroneo* Right-minded Mark 5:15, Luke 8:35, 2 Cor 5:13,14

## Standard for judging sober thinking

- "measure of faith"
  - Must be understood in context with 4-8
    - Not the amount of faith , but the *measure, sphere, or range* which God has assigned to the *faith of each member* – 2 Cor 10:12-16, Eph 4:7,13,16
- Summary
  - 1) Many members of one body in Christ
  - 2) Individually the members belong to each other
  - 3) Each has different gifts
  - 4) All are a matter of grace *given to us <u>NOT</u> achieved by us*

## Parts of the body

- Many parts in <u>one body</u>
  - One body in Christ
    - Through baptism we are in Him
  - Parts of one another
    - Out of Him is diversity and isolation
    - In Him is union, togetherness, unity
    - We all benefit from **gifts** we do not personally possess
      - Gifts in varying form and degree given according to grace – vs 6-8 – all parts of one body thinking soberly

#### Gifts Illustrated

- Prophecy
  - To declare a message received by direct revelation from God
  - In proportion to one's faith our measure or sphere
- Service
  - Set apart from prophecy, teaching and exhorting
  - Indicates action rather than word
- Teaching
  - No direct revelation from God expounding upon the revelation of others

#### Gifts Illustrated

- Exhortation
  - One who can stir up the hearts of others encouragement
- Giving
  - Supplying the needs of others without hidden motive
- Leadership
  - Being out in front elders zeal, earnestness, not waiting around, not simply responding. Acting rather than reacting
- Mercy
  - Pity, compassion to the miserable not grudgingly but happy

#### To summarize so far...

#### We Must

- Offer our bodies a living sacrifice
- Seek to do the will of God by renewing our minds
- Use sober judgement in accord with the measure or sphere which belongs to our faith given us by God

### We Must Not

- Be conformed to this world
- Seek to put our own will ahead of God
- Think too highly of ourselves or assume God gives everyone the same gifts or sphere of faith
