Romans 12:9-21
The Surrendered Life – We must serve the will of God and not our own will.

- Rom 12:9 Let love be without hypocrisy. Abhor that which is evil; cleave to that which is good.
- Rom 12:10 In love of the brethren be tenderly affectioned one to another; in honor preferring one another; (ASV)

- Rom 12:11 in diligence not slothful; fervent in spirit; serving the Lord;
- Rom 12:12 rejoicing in hope; patient in tribulation; continuing stedfastly in prayer;
- Rom 12:13 communicating to the necessities of the saints; given to hospitality.
- Rom 12:14 Bless them that persecute you; bless, and curse not.

## A shift in Emphasis

#### Romans 12:3-8

- Each person has their own place – "God has dealt to each a measure of faith" (V.3)
- Sacrificing self to God's Design
- Together we become the body

### Romans 12:8-15:13

 General instructions for all individual christians regardless of their "measure of faith"

- Rom 12:9 Let love be without hypocrisy. Abhor that which is evil; cleave to that which is good.
- Rom 12:10 In love of the brethren be tenderly affectioned one to another; in honor preferring one another; (ASV)

# As vs. 2 is a statement of the basic instruction, so vss. 9-10

## 9 dative statements follow as illustrations

(a grammatical case used in some languages to indicate the recipient or beneficiary of an action)

- Rom 12:9 Let love be without hypocrisy. Abhor that which is evil; cleave to that which is good.

**G4285** (Strong)

to *lead the way* for others, that is, *show deference:* - prefer.

### **Dative Case**

The dative case is the case that shows the <u>indirect object</u> of a verb.

The indirect object of a verb is the recipient of the <u>direct</u> <u>object</u>.

Example: Give her a present.

- In this example, the direct object is "a present."
- The recipient is "her" which is the indirect object and in the dative case.

  - Communicating

- In rejoicing
  - Rejoicing
- In weeping
  - Weeping

- Overcome evil with good
