1 Finally then, brethren, we request and exhort you in the Lord Jesus, that as you received from us instruction as to how you ought to walk and please God (just as you actually do walk), that you excel still more.

2 John 2:12-14

- 12 I am writing to you, <u>little children</u>, because <u>your sins have</u> <u>been forgiven</u> you for His name's sake.
- **13** I am writing to you, fathers, because you know Him who has been from the beginning. I am writing to you, <u>young men</u>, because <u>you have overcome the evil one</u>. I have written to you, children, because you know the Father.
- 14 I have written to you, <u>fathers</u>, because <u>you know Him who</u> has been from the beginning. I have written to you, <u>young</u> men, because <u>you are strong</u>, and the word of God abides in you, and you have overcome the evil one.

- d. Their spiritual walk (Rom. 12:9-21, Gal. 5:16—26)

- The fundamentals of Christian
- living:
- A. Strive to please God
- B. Glorify God in everything

Pleasing God and Glorifying Him in everything

1. Confess your sins regularly (Ps. 32:5; Isa. 1:18–19; Matt. 6:12; 1 John 1:9);

2. Pray continually and trust Him (Ps. 27:8; Phil. 4:6; 1 Thess. 5:17; 1 Tim. 2:8; Heb. 4:16; 10:22; James 1:6);

3. Pursue humility (Matt. 20:26–28; Eph. 4:1–2; Phil. 2:3–4; Col. 3:12; James 4:6);

4. Be content with God's will (cf. Ps. 37:16; 1 Tim. 6:6, 8; Heb. 13:5);

5. Know God's will as it is revealed in His Word (Ps. 119:105; Prov. 6:23; 2 Tim. 3:16–17; 2 Peter 1:19);

6. Be willing to suffer for His name (Matt. 5:10–12; John 15:20; Acts 5:41; 2 Tim. 3:12);

Pleasing God and Glorifying Him in everything

- 7. Teach the lost (Matt. 4:19; 28:19–20; Mark 16:15; 2 Cor. 5:20; 2 Tim. 4:5);
- 8. Celebrate the Lord's Supper (Luke 22:19; 1 Cor. 11:23-28);
- 9. Care for one another (Acts 2:44–46; Gal. 6:2; Phil. 2:3–4; 1 Thess. 5:11, 14; Heb. 13:1–3; James 1:27);
- 10. Honor God in your marriages and families (Eph. 5:22–6:4; Col. 3:18–21; 1 Tim. 5:3–16; Titus 2:1–8; Heb. 13:4);

11. Be diligent and fruitful in all avenues of service (Matt. 3:8; Eph. 2:10; Col. 1:10; 2 Tim. 3:16–17; Titus 3:8, 14; Heb. 10:24; Heb. 13:21).

3. What are God's desires for our sexuality?

1 Thess. 4:3

- 3 For this is the will of God, your
- sanctification; that is, that you

abstain from sexual immorality;

Abstain from sexual immorality

- 3. What are God's desires for our sexuality? Romans 13:14
- **14** But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

1 Corinthians 6:18

18 Flee from sexual immorality. Every other sin a person commits is outside the body, but the sexually immoral person sins against his own body.

3. What are God's desires for our sexuality? Ephesians 5:5

5 For you may be sure of this, that everyone who is sexually immoral or impure, or who is covetous (that is, an idolater), has no inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and God.

Colossians 3:5

5 Put to death therefore what is earthly in you: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry.

3. What are God's desires for our sexuality? Hebrews 13:4

4 Let marriage be held in honor among all, and let the marriage bed be undefiled, for God will judge the sexually immoral and adulterous.

1 Timothy 4:12

12 Let no one despise you for your youth, but set the believers an example in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith, in purity.

- 3. What are God's desires for our sexuality? Titus 2:12
- **12** Training us to renounce ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright, and godly lives in the present age,

- 4. How does Paul characterize the heathen? 1 Thess. 4:4-5
- 4 that each of you know how to possess his own vessel in sanctification and
- honor, 5 not in lustful passion, like the Gentiles who do not know God;
- The heathen:
- A. Pursue lustful passion.
- B. Do not know God.

5. What does sanctification mean? Sanctification is a process of cleansing from sin and growing in purity, especially in the mind, heart, and actions.

It involves separation and

purification for God's purposes.

5. What does sanctification mean?
John 17:17-19
17 "Sanctify them in the truth; Your word is truth.

18 "As You sent Me into the world, I also have sent them into the world.

19 "For their sakes I sanctify Myself, that they themselves also may be sanctified in truth.

- 6. How could someone transgress and defraud a brother?
- 1 Thess. 4:6
- 6 and that no man transgress and
- defraud his brother in the matter
- because the Lord is the avenger in
- all these things, just as we also told you before and solemnly warned

6. How could someone transgress and defraud a brother?

- **Vs 4** Possess his own vessel in sanctification and honor,
- Vs 5 Do not engage in lustful passion
- Vs 6 They should never sexually take advantage of other believers.



- 7. How might understanding our identity as children of God influence our interactions with both Christians and non-Christians?
- 1 Thess. 4:7-8
- 7 For <u>God has not called us for the purpose</u> of impurity, but in sanctification.
- 8 So, <u>he who rejects this is not rejecting man</u> but the God who gives His Holy Spirit to you.

- 7. How might understanding our identity as children of God influence our interactions with both Christians and non-Christians?
- A. God has called us to purity.
- 1. Our lives should be transformed.
- 2. Our minds should be changed.
- 3. Our hearts should be transformed.
- **B.** All men and women need God's grace.

The Christian should display a Christ-like attitude while serving both Christians and non-Christians.
