Proverbs 18:2

Eph. 4:26-27 26 Be angry, and *yet* do not sin; do not let

the sun go down on your anger,

27 and do not give the devil an opportunity.

James 1:21 21 Therefore, putting aside all filthiness and all that remains of wickedness, in humility receive the word implanted, which is able to save your souls.

2. How should we receive the Word of God?

Receive God's Word in meekness and humility.

2. How should we receive the Word of God? Filthiness refers to any sort of moral defilement or impurity.

Wickedness denotes moral evil and corruption in general, especially in regard to intent.

It pertains to sin that is deliberate and determined.

It may reside in the heart for a long time before being expressed outwardly, and may, in fact, never be expressed outwardly.

James 1:22-25

- 22 But prove yourselves doers of the word, and not merely hearers who delude themselves.
- 23 For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man who looks at his natural face in a mirror;
- 24 for once he has looked at himself and gone away, he has immediately forgotten what kind of person he was.
- 25 But one who looks intently at the perfect law, the *law* of liberty, and abides by it, not having become a forgetful hearer but an effectual doer, this man will be blessed in what he does.

It is not about how many doctrines you know, how many verses you have memorized, how well you know Greek or Hebrew, or how many times you have read the Bible.

You can go to a thousand Bible studies and listen to ten thousand sermons; however, it is worthless if you don't decide to follow them.

Christianity is all about putting the principles we learn in the Bible into practice.

There are 3 elements to hearing and receiving the Word:

- 1. Submission
- 2. Purity
- 3. Humility

There are 3 elements in obeying the Word:

- 1. In relation to himself, the Christian is willing to apply the Word without deception;
- 2. In relation to others, the Christian is willing to apply the Word without selfishness;
- 3. In relation to the world, the Christian is willing to apply the Word without compromise.

James 1:26

26 If anyone thinks himself to be religious, and yet does not bridle his tongue but deceives his own heart, this man's religion is worthless.

A loose tongue:

- 1. Interrupting and dominating the conversation
- 2. Being easily provoked and lashing out at others
- 3. Gossiping and telling tales
- 4. Criticizing and murmuring

A loose tongue:

- 5. Judging and condemning others
- 6. Using name-calling and cursing
- 7. Engaging in suggestive and off-colored talk
- 8. Talking about and running down others

Eph. 4:31

31 Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice.

Titus 3:1-2

- 1 Remind them to be subject to rulers, to authorities, to be obedient, to be ready for every good deed,
- 2 to malign no one, to be peaceable, gentle, showing every consideration for all men.

James 1:27 27 Pure and undefiled religion in the sight of our God and Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their distress, and to keep oneself unstained by the world.

- 1. Display <u>practical compassion</u> to <u>orphans and widows</u> in distress
- a. Christians are to be have a genuine concern for the welfare of others, especially those who are in great need.

- 2. Demonstrate the <u>religion</u> that God our Father accepts as <u>pure and faultless</u> both in our <u>personal life</u> and our <u>public life</u>.
- a. Christians are to have a pure and loving heart by the way they talk and the way they act.

b. Christians are to be willing to apply the Word of God without compromise.
