- 24 Faithful is He who calls you, and He also will bring it to pass.
- 25 Brethren, pray for us.
- 26 Greet all the brethren with a holy kiss.
- 27 I adjure you by the Lord to have this letter read to all the brethren.

- 6. Why does Paul exhort the Thessalonians to "greet all brethren with a holy kiss"?
- A. In some cultures, this greeting shows appropriate affection and politeness when greeting brothers and sisters in Christ.
- B. The universal principle is to greet other believers warmly, which in our case could be a warm handshake with a friendly verbal greeting.
